

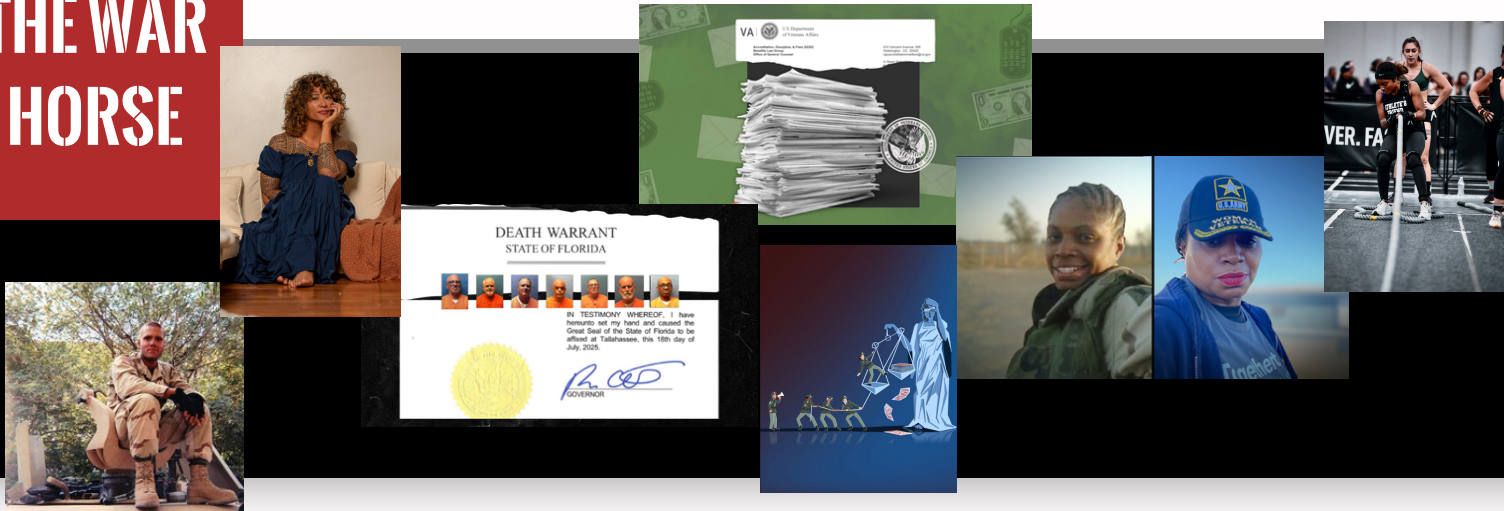

Ten years ago, I was filing the articles of incorporation and filming a Kickstarter video that brought The War Horse to life. I remain honored to be a steward of our archive of reflections, which now numbers nearly 500 reflections. 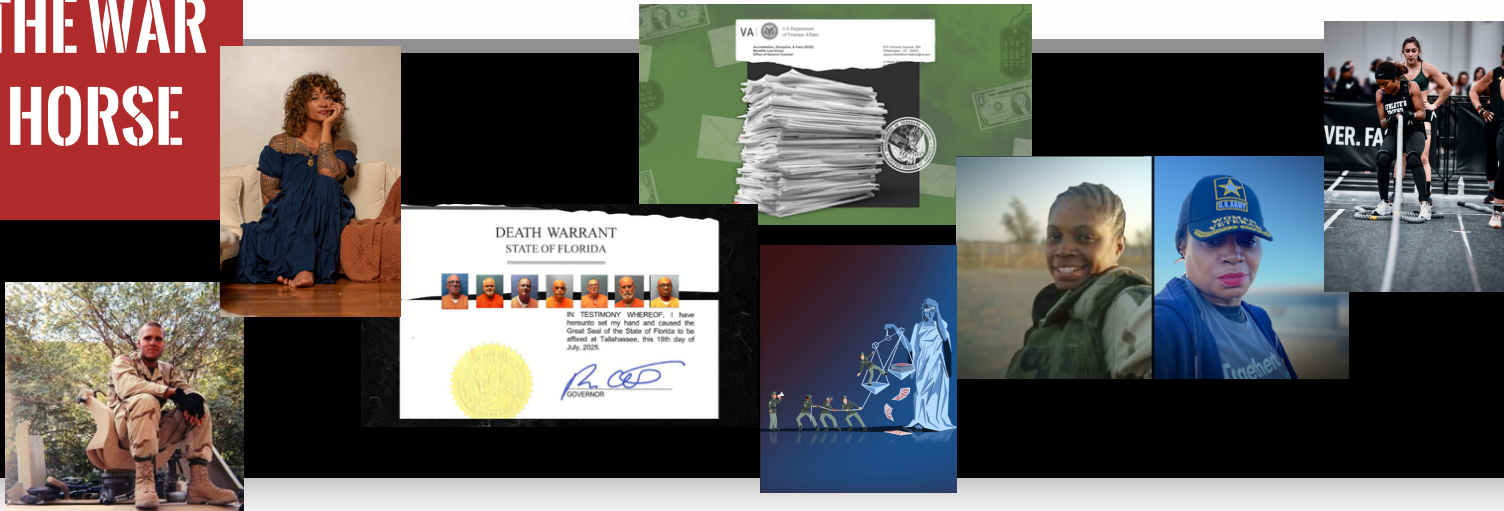

Over the years, our reporting has changed federal and military laws, and we have partnered with local and national newsrooms across our country. This quarter, our team was recognized with two more journalism awards and published a months-long investigation with NPR, which uncovered how dozens of for-profit companies that charge disabled veterans thousands of dollars for help filing for disability claims are ignoring warning letters from VA that their business practices may be breaking the law. Upon publication, Leah appeared on NPR's Weekend Edition to discuss the coverage.

This quarter, our team also partnered with The Texas Tribune to publish reporting by freelancer Rachel Fobar, who dug into the military justice system to reveal how thousands of service members and veterans are being flagged in the FBI's national database for crimes they didn't commit. The obscure process is called "titling" – a designation that follows service members who may have simply been brought up in an investigation in a military justice matter. This designation can block them, years later, in civilian life, from jobs, security clearances, and even from passing a background check to coach a youth sports team or chaperone their kids on a school field trip. Rachel's report became the most-read news story in The War Horse's history and generated dozens of tips and responses from readers sharing their own stories.

As our team wraps up another impactful year and prepares for our second decade of impact, I want to thank supporters like you for your unwavering support of our work. We could not do this without you.

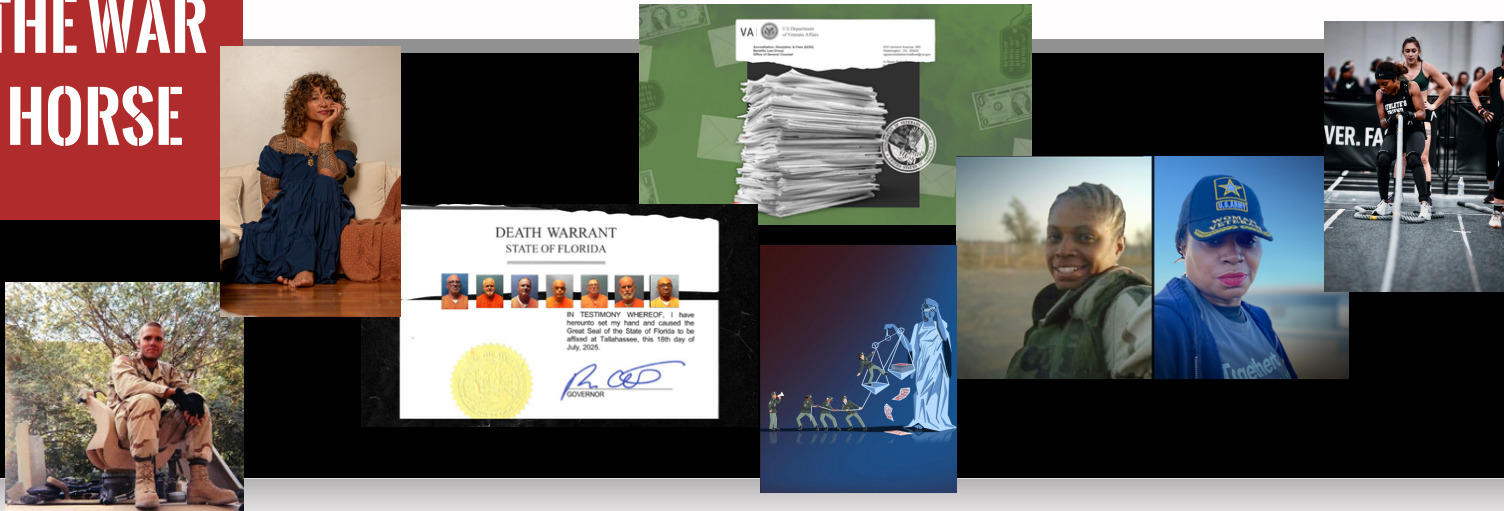

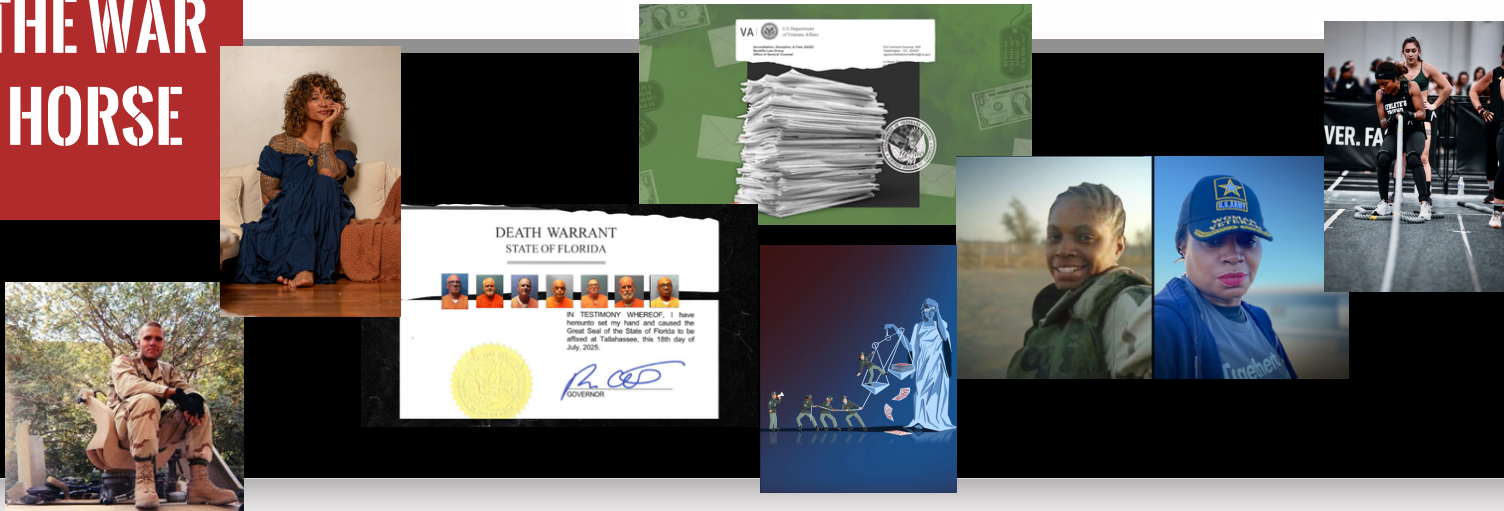
